

PARANORMAL EXPERIENCES EXPLAINED AT LAST



After the largest investigation ever into the paranormal, a team of British scientists has come to the conclusion that there are no such things as ghosts. Their research, however, does prove the existence haunted of houses.

The scientists from the University of Hertfordshire used two of the most haunted places in Britain for their research: Hampton Court, one of the palaces belonging to Henry VIII in London, and the South Bridge Vaults, a series of dimly-lit rooms built under a bridge in Edinburgh. The ghost of one of Henry VIII's six wives, Catherine Howard, is said to live in Hampton Court, and people have seen the ghost of a boy pulling terrified visitors' clothes in the South Bridge Vaults.

In the Hampton Court experiment a guard showed the scientists the areas in the palace where petrified people have reported seeing ghosts. The team then asked 462 visitors to walk around the palace and tell them if, and where, they felt anything strange. Many of the areas where the frightened visitors felt a strange sensation corresponded exactly to the areas identified by the guard. However, when the scientists analysed these scary spots with their equipment, they discovered that they often stood in a draught or in dark places where there was very little light.

In Edinburgh, a tour guide chose ten rooms in the South Bridge Vaults and put them in order according to the number of frightening paranormal experiences people have had in them. Then 200 volunteers were put into groups of twenty and each group went to spend ten minutes in one of the ten rooms. Afterwards they answered questions about their sensations in the gloomy room. The scientists found that the most haunted rooms were the smallest and the darkest, especially when there was a brightly-lit corridor outside.

The results of these two experiments led the scientists to conclude that people do not actually see a ghost when they have a paranormal experience, but they feel something spooky that they interpret as a ghost. In other words, in the opinion of the Hertfordshire scientists, ahosts do not exist but haunted houses do.


